HISTORY OF THE USS ALLENTOWN

Following is the complete history of the USS Allentown taken from the files of U.S. Bureau of Naval Histories and is supplemented by information received from Captain E. G. Cardwell, a former captain of the Allentown.

Allentown is a city in Pennsylvania located on the Lehigh River.

Data - PF 52; dp 1489; length 303; width 37'6; draft 13'8";
s.20.4k; complement 190; armament 3 3"50 D.P.; class Tacoma

Allentown, PF 52 launched July 3, 1943 by Froeming Bros. Inc., Milwaukee, Wisconsin and sponsored by Miss Joyce Beary of Allentown, Pa. It was commissioned at the New Orleans Navy Yard on March 24, 1944, Commander Gary W. Collins in command and reported to the Operational Training Command, Atlantic Fleet, for duty.

In the summer of 1944, Allentown joined Escort Division 33 and steamed to the Pacific, arriving at Finschhafen, New Guinea on September 29. Until March 1945, she attended to duty in the Dutch East Indies on patrol, escort and convoy assignments, and took part briefly in the Western New Guinea operation (October 30-31, 1944) and the Leyte operation (November 15 - 29, 1944). On March 9, she joined a Ulithi bound convoy as an escort, after which she steamed to Hawaii and the United States arriving April 7, 1945 at Puget Sound Navy Yard to undergo a yard overhaul.

Allentown departed Puget Sound June 7, 1945 and proceeded to Kodiak, then Cold Bay Alaska where she participated in scheduled exercises and drills. (Training Russian sailors to operate the ship). She was decommissioned at Cold Bay on July 12, 1945 and leased to Russia in August 1945. She received two battle stars for her service in World War II.

On October 15, 1949, she was returned to Naval custody by Russia at Yok-osu-ka, Japan. Allentown remained at Yokosuka, out of commission, until she was loaned to Japan in August 1962. She was renamed UME and designated PF 289, and she was one of 18 frigates in the TREE class of the Japanese Navy.

The Allentown - UME was hulked in 1965.

***The sister ships in Escort Division 33 were: PF 25 Charlottesville, PF 53 Machias and PF 54 Sandusky.

The history, picture and commissioning pennant were presented to the Lehigh County Historical Museum by former crew members and officers attending the reunion celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Allentown on July 4, 1964 held at the Americus Hotel in Allentown, Pa.

"Tacoma" class:

This class was built to the British "River" design by the United States Navy with slight modifications to incorporate all-welded construction, and they were rigged with only a pole foremast which carried the SW.RDF aerial. Later units had the light A.A. armament increased to nine 20mm A.A. with guns added amidships (2 x 1) and aft (3 x 1), and most earlier units were also brought up to this standard. They were originally classed as gunboats (PG.111-210) but were re-rated as frigates (PF) while building. They closely resembled the British frigates in appearance, but could be easily distinguished by their heavier gun armament and pole foremast.

Because of the design's mercantile origins contracts were placed by the Maritime Commission on behalf of the United States Navy, which eased the supervisory load borne by the latter with the vast war building programmes in hand. In view of the large destroyer escort (DE) programme, and the individual superiority of the destroyer escort compared with the frigate (PF), the provision for frigates was relatively modest and only one hundred were ordered. Of these twenty-one were transferred to the Royal Navy under Lend/Lease and four were cancelled, and the balance were turned over to the United States Coast Guard for manning. Towards the close of the war twenty-eight frigates were loaned to the Soviet Navy as part of the military price to secure the U.S.S.R.'s participation in the planned invasion of Japan.






The U.S.S. MACHIAS was sponsored by Mrs. Richard Bernays, wife of Lieut. (j.g.) Bernays, U.S.N. The Frigate MACHIAS is named for Machias, Maine, which figured in the first American naval victory in the Revolutionary War. Captain More of the English vessel MARGARETTA was brought to Machias mortally wounded after that engagement. Machias has a notable shipping record and has been the home of many sea captains.

The U.S.S. SANDUSKY was sponsored by Miss Mabel Apel, daughter of George J. Apel, Mayor of Sandusky, Ohio.


The U.S.S. BATH was sponsored by Mrs. Fred R. E. Dean, a pioneer citizen of Bath, Maine, whose family for many years has been identified with shipbuilding, her family having operated a shipyard building wooden ships in Bath from 1886 until a decade ago. Bath, Maine, has long been noted for its shipbuilding activities, and at the present time shipyards in that city are building large numbers of destroyers for the U. S. Navy.




Launching of the U.S.S. SANDUSKY.




Launching of the U.S.S. MACHIAS.
